Hannah modified the interview guide for the inquiry with her core group consisting of 1st and 4th year students at Pennsylvania State University Abington College. The Core Group identified the inquiry as What Creates the Best Transformational or Deep Learning Experience in the College Classroom."

The composition of the groups was heterogeneous, including students who were at different stages in their educational experience (lower and upper classmen) and representing a varied range of majors. **Hannah** reported the process of identifying the Provocative Propositions visibly £hanged the energyqin the room as students who had not previously participated very much became vocal and energized by the exercise.+

The inquiry exceeded **Hannah's** expectations, learning that it is \$\partial \text{ossible}\$ (and a good thing) to take some risks, and to try new approaches with groups that are ordinarily unaccustomed to this level of introspection and dialogue.+**Hannah's** personal best experience related was setting the stage, outlining the steps, and then watching the groups take off on their own with vibrancy and vitality! **Hannah** wrote to **Nancy Stetson** \$\partial \text{wow} -- the students came up with incredible dream statements, and they really were able to respond to the process.+**Hannah** sees potential for higher education and looks forward to reaching out to others on the college campus. Good Luck Hannah!
